INTRODUCTION

This is a legal review of an officer-involved shooting incident that occurred shortly after 10:00 p.m., on June 24, 2019, outside of the residence located at 6266 McKinley Terrace, Englewood, Charlotte County, Florida. The incident involved an individual, Bradley D. Rundle, who was involved in a domestic disturbance at the residence. and with the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office responded and used deadly force against Mr. Rundle by firing their duty firearms at him. When discharged their firearms, Bradley Rundle had just fired a gun toward another member of the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office. Bradley Rundle received two (2) gunshot wounds and died as a result of his injuries.

The use of force investigation was conducted by Detective Matthew Piloto of the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office (ChCSO). Detective Piloto provided this office with his report and supplemental documentation. An independent agency was not used for this investigation. gave statements.

At approximately 8:50 p.m. the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office began receiving 911 calls. Kimberly Rundle, Bradley Rundle's wife, called 911. In the call she tells the operator that her "husband has a gun" and that "he shot the door" and that "he's been drinking." Mary Rundle (later identified as one of the daughters) called 911, screaming "we need someone here at 6266 McKinley Terrace right now, there's a gun" before being disconnected. Upon callback, Mary Rundle told the operator, that her dad (Bradley Rundle) was "very intoxicated" and that "he shot at my brother-in-law." A third 911 call came in from a neighbor located at 6234 McKinley Terrace who handed the call off to Tyler Dodd who told the operator that his father-in-law (Bradley Rundle) had shot at him, that he was "armed and dangerous" and that he has multiple guns in the house. This information was disseminated to the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office via radio transmission.

Several members of the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office began to arrive, including members of the Immediate Action Team (The Team). It was determined that all of the family members were outside of the home and at a safe distance away. A perimeter was set up. The Team consisted of _____ armed with his duty issued rifle; _____ armed with his duty issued rifle; _____ armed with a less lethal shotgun; and _____ carrying ballistic shields. _____ assisted the team by using a patrol vehicle's Public Address (P.A.) system to communicate with Mr. Rundle.

The Team was positioned approximately sixty (60) yards away, across the street, at an angle from the residence where Mr. Rundle was. The location provided some concealment as well as cover. Another marked patrol unit was positioned at the corner of McKinley Terrace and Sheffield Lane, using its headlights to illuminate the front driveway area of Mr. Rundle's home.

For approximately one (1) hour, Mr. Rundle could be seen walking in and out of the residence. During this time, members of the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office were giving repeated commands for Mr. Rundle to come outside, "show his hands" and to "surrender peacefully." These commands were being given via the P.A. system as well as being shouted by deputies on scene. Mr. Rundle was heard responding by yelling "fuck you" and "let's do this."

At approximately 10:00 p.m., _____ with the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office made phone contact with Mr. Rundle through Mr. Rundle's cell phone. For several minutes, _____ requested Mr. Rundle to surrender peacefully. Mr. Rundle refused to listen. Instead, Mr. Rundle made threatening remarks toward all the deputies on scene including "if you come knock on my door, this will be the last door you ever knock on."

Moments after the phone contact was made, Mr. Rundle came out of the residence and began walking down the driveway, toward the street. His walk was described by some deputies as one "with purpose." As Mr. Rundle continued to walk down the driveway toward the street and the surrounding deputies, some heard a gun being racked or cocked.

observed Mr. Rundle walk down the driveway. They both observed him get to the end of the driveway and take a shooting stance. They both observed him shoot toward the P.A. vehicle and . After hearing the gunfire, began to shoot at Mr. Rundle. Mr. Rundle began to move back toward the house until he fell, face down, after being hit by gunfire. fired a total of forty-eight (48) rounds. No other law enforcement officer fired their weapon.

Tyler Dodd gave a statement. He stated he, his wife and four (4) minor children were visiting. He stated his wife's sisters were there with their significant others and minor children. Mr. Dodd stated that a family argument ensued. He stated that Mr. Rundle at some point placed a gun on the table outside by the pool. Mr. Dodd stated he grabbed the gun and walked into the house, telling his wife and kids to get out of the house. Mr. Dodd stated he heard Mary (one of Mr. Rundle's daughters) screaming "he's got another gun."

Mr. Dodd stated he was holding the door (from the living room to the garage) shut as he was telling everyone to get out of the house. He stated as this was happening four (4) shots came through the door. He stated that as he was running away from the house, he threw the gun that he had grabbed earlier back toward the house and it smashed through a window. He stated that he ran to a neighbor's house asking them to call 911 – telling them that his father-in-law was shooting at him. Mr. Dodd stated that while he and the rest of the family were in a safe area he heard gun fire.

The other adult family members gave statements, which were consistent with Mr. Dodd's.

gave a statement. He stated he was dispatched to a disturbance at the 6266 McKinley Terrace address. He heard via radio transmission that there was a male armed with a gun and had fired shots. As he arrived, he came in contact with an older female (later identified as Kimberly Rundle) outside and down the road from the address in question. The female told that her husband had a gun and shot in the house.

stated that he took a position across the street from 6266 McKinley Terrace. He stated from there, he was able to see a male (later identified as Mr. Rundle) walking in the driveway of 6266 McKinley Terrace. stated he gave a loud command for the individual to get on the ground but the individual did not comply. stated other members of The Team gathered in the same area he was in, including the P.A. operator – stated several commands were given over the P.A. system to no avail. stated he heard the individual yell back "fuck you" and "let's get it on." stated the individual kept going in and out of the house.

stated that he then observed the individual come outside and walk down the driveway, toward law enforcement, "with a purpose." stated that as the individual walked toward the street he then stopped and took a "combat stance" and pulled up a gun and fired toward the P.A. vehicle, which was close to where he and the rest of The Team was. At that point, stated he began to fire and did so until the individual went down.

stated he and members of The Team approached the individual and rolled him over. stated he observed a gun on the ground and it was pushed away. stated he and members of The Team began life saving measures on Mr. Rundle.

gave a statement. He stated he heard dispatch reference a domestic disturbance at 6266 McKinley Terrace with shots fired and the father shooting at family members. stated as he was initially positioning himself, he observed an individual (later identified as Bradley Rundle) outside the residence and yelled verbal commands for him to get on the ground. stated he heard the individual yell "fuck you." stated that for the next hour or so, several commands were given to the individual using a P.A. system. described the situation as a standoff.

stated he was now positioned near and the rest of The Team. stated that after about an hour of this standoff he heard the slide of a gun being "cocked." verbalized what he had just heard to everyone nearby, which included The Team.

stated he then observed the individual walk down the driveway with "confidence" and could see something in his right hand. stated he then observed the individual take a "competitive stance" and took one (1) shot toward the P.A. unit. stated he then began to fire at the individual. stated The Team then advanced toward the individual, who was lying face down on the driveway. stated he observed a gun on the ground near the individual's head. stated he observed members of The Team perform life saving measures on Mr. Rundle until Emergency Medical Services (EMS) arrived.

gave a statement. was the person using the P.A. system to communicate with Mr. Rundle. stated he was using a patrol car parked close to The Team. stated he was commanding Mr. Rundle to show his hands. stated he observed Mr. Rundle point at him and heard a "bang, a small caliber firearm go off towards me" and then heard the return fire by law enforcement. stated he did not discharge his firearm.

Mr. Rundle was pronounced dead at the scene by EMS.

An autopsy was performed on Mr. Rundle. He was found to have suffered from two (2) gunshot wounds. One (1) was to the right side of the head, which was a through-and-through. The other gunshot wound was to the right hip. A projectile was recovered.

ChCSO crime scene technicians processed two scenes. The first was the 6266 McKinley Terrace address. The second was the location where the Immediate Action Team was positioned across the street at 6283 McKinley Terrace.

At the 6266 McKinley Terrace address, the following of significance was recovered: one (1) Kahr 9mm handgun recovered from the driveway near Mr. Rundle's body (with an opened slide due to what appeared to be a jammed unfired round); one (1) spent 9mm cartridge casing located near the middle of the driveway, down toward the street; one (1) Beretta 9mm handgun recovered from inside the garage; and one (1) spent cartridge casing located on the living room floor near the door that leads out to the garage. These items were photographed and collected.

Eleven (11) live 9mm rounds and four (4) spent cartridge casings were found in Mr. Rundle's right shorts pocket. One (1) fully loaded fifteen (15) round 9mm magazine and a set of keys were located in his left shorts pocket.

At the 6283 McKinley Terrace address the following was recovered: forty-eight (48) spent Speer 14 .223 cartridge casings; one (1) live Speer 14 .223 live round; one (1) bullet fragment located underneath the patrol vehicle being used for the P.A. announcements; and rifle magazine with eight (8) live .223 rounds inside. These items were photographed and collected.

Sig Sauer semiautomatic rifle was collected. Sig Sauer semiautomatic rifle was also collected.

A neighborhood canvas was conducted. Several neighbors heard gunshots, but did not see the actual shooting. No video of the actual shooting exists or body worn camera footage.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) conducted analysis of the firearms collected, some of the cartridge casings recovered, and some of the projectiles recovered. It was determined that all four (4) firearms collected were functioning properly.

FDLE determined that the fired 9mm cartridge casing located in the middle of the driveway, down toward the street, was fired from the Kahr Arms 9mm handgun that Mr. Rundle had in his hand at the time he was shot and located next to his body on the driveway.

FDLE also determined that the fired 9mm cartridge casing located inside the residence on the living room floor near the door that leads to the garage, was fired from the same Kahr Arms 9mm handgun.

The fired bullet located under the patrol car that was using for the P.A. was determined to have no value for microscopic comparison. The fired bullet recovered from Mr. Rundle's hip was determined to be a 22/5mm caliber class, which displayed characteristics similar to firearms by Sigarms (Sig Sauer), Bushmaster, and Colt, among others.

FDLE also swabbed the rough surfaces and sight areas of the Kahr 9mm handgun that was recovered from the driveway near Mr. Rundle's body.

Bradley Rundle committed an aggravated assault with a firearm on law enforcement officers, which is a forcible felony as defined by *Florida Statute §776.08*, when he deliberately shot

toward and other law enforcement officers in the area. The actions committed by Mr. Rundle presented a significant danger to the law enforcement officers carrying out their duties, putting them in reasonable fear of imminent death or great bodily harm. were justified in the use of deadly force to stop the threat.

CONCLUSION

were reasonably justified in using deadly force to protect themselves and others from the danger Bradley Rundle posed during the evening hours on June 24, 2019. For the reasons set forth above, there is no basis for further action by this office. This matter should be closed.

On June 24, 2019, the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office deadly force upon Bradley D Rundle, a White Male, born on September 3, 1957. The incident occurred at 6266 McKinley Terrace, Englewood, Florida 34224. Rundle died as a result of his injuries.

Investigator Tharaldsen reviewed the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office investigative report, 1906-012414 that was prepared by Detective Matthew Piloto in reference to the use of lethal force by

This report was received on June 29, 2019, and along with supplemental reports and documents received through December 18, 2019 were used in this review. The Charlotte County Sheriff's Office did not use an independent investigative agency in reference to this incident. The following information was documented through the recorded sworn statements of _____ worn statements of witnesses and family members of Bradley Rundle, 9-1-1 calls, dispatch logs, audio recordings, along with forensic and crime scene processing.

Synopsis:

On Monday, June 24, 2019, Kimberly and her husband Bradley Rundle hosted a family gathering at their residence, located at 6266 McKinley Terrace, Englewood, Florida. The guests included: their daughter Jennifer Dodd, her husband Tyler, and Dodd's children, Awnah Dodd (17 year old daughter), Jameson Dodd (5 year old son), Fitzgerald Dodd (3 year old son), and Stevie Dodd (2 year old son); daughter, Elizabeth Rundle, her fiancé, Carl Bailey along with their children Oliver Bailey (3 year old son) and Flynn Bailey (2 year old son); and daughter Mary Rundle and her boyfriend, Austin Tracy.

The gathering consisted of barbecuing, swimming, and drinking alcoholic beverages. After several hours the sisters Jennifer, Elizabeth, and Mary got into an argument about previous issues between them. The verbal argument continued and began to get loud eventually causing their significant others to get involved. As the argument continued Carl and Tyler began to accuse the sister's mom, Kim of instigating the fights between them. This got Bradley Rundle extremely upset that his wife was being accused of starting the argument and he pulled out a handgun (Beretta 9MM) with a laser sight on it and pointed it in the area of Carl and Tyler. Bradley then argued with Carl and accused him of not being able to take care of his daughter. Bradley's actions caused everyone to fear for their safety and they began

to gather their belongings to leave. Elizabeth and Carl got their kids into their vehicle and drove away. Bradley at one point had the handgun placed on the table in front of him on the back porch and Tyler took the opportunity to grab the gun and made sure it was safe by cycling the slide and making sure there was no magazine in it, so Bradley couldn't hurt anyone with it. Bradley then went upstairs and retrieved a second handgun (Kahr 9MM).

Knowing that Bradley was armed with a second handgun everyone began exiting the residence. Tyler stayed near the interior door to the garage and held it closed so he could keep Bradley inside the residence until everyone was safely out. From inside the house, Bradley fired numerous shots through the interior garage door leading into the garage nearly striking Tyler, who then fled from the residence and called 9-1-1 for assistance. While Tyler was fleeing from the residence he threw the handgun he took from Bradley into the garage.

At approximately 8:51 P.M., Charlotte County Sheriff's Deputies were dispatched to this incident. As deputies began to arrive they made contact with some of Bradley's family members who had fled from the scene. The family members had become separated as they ran from the residence and eventually were met by deputies and all taken to a safe location. The responding deputies began their preliminary investigation and gathered more information about what occurred inside the residence. They confirmed a male, now identified as Bradley Rundle was inside the residence, armed with a handgun and had shot at his family members. The deputies were also informed that Bradley was intoxicated.

A perimeter around the residence was established and an Immediate Action Team was assembled to address any resistance from Bradley who was now barricaded inside. The Immediate Action Team consisted of
Sauer M400 rifle, .223 caliber, (Sig Sauer M400 rifle,
.223 caliber, (Remington 870, 12 gauge, less-lethal shotgun,
(ballistic shield) and (ballistic shield).
The team was accompanied by who was sitting in a marked patrol vehicle, utilizing the Public
Announcement (P.A.) system in an effort to communicate with Bradley.

This team took a position across the street between a wooded area and the residence located at 6283 McKinley Terrace, approximately 60 yards away. The location was at an off angle in view of the south-west corner of Bradley's house. The location provided both concealment and hard cover to prevent Bradley from seeing them.

also positioned his patrol vehicle near the intersection of McKinley Terrace and Sheffield Lane, so the lights illuminated the driveway of Bradley's residence. positioned themselves at the rear
north-east corner of the residence and were armed with shields and rifles.

For the next hour from approximately 9:00PM – 10:00PM, the Immediate Action Team and perimeter deputies saw Bradley walking in and out of the residence several times. Bradley was seen staggering while he was walking and appeared intoxicated. During this time, Bradley ignored all verbal commands to come outside, show his hands, and surrender peacefully. Bradley was heard saying "fuck you" and "let's do this", in response to their commands.

made contact with Bradley via his cell phone with the number provided by Bradley's
wife, Kimberly just before 10:00 PM. attempted to build a good rapport with Bradley for several
minutes and plead with him to come outside and surrender peacefully. Bradley refused to listen and made threats to
all of the deputies outside, going on to say, "if you come knock on my door, this will be the last door you ever knock
on" and then hung up on Moments later, Bradley exited his residence for the final time.

Bradley walked from the garage area, down the driveway toward the street with much more momentum than on previous trips outside. Bradley was reported to have been "walking with a purpose" towards the end of the driveway. Deputies could hear the sound of Bradley's handgun being loaded as the slide of the gun was being cycled. The Immediate Action Team began to back further away and concealed themselves even further behind 6283 McKinley. Bradley came into clearer view of the Immediate Action Team and they could see a handgun in his hand. As Bradley approached the end of the driveway, he took a two hand shooting stance and fired a single round at the P.A. vehicle and the Immediate Action Team. After Bradley's first shot, it is believed his handgun malfunctioned and failed to chamber the next round from its fully loaded magazine preventing him from firing anymore, however this was unknown to the deputies at the time.

Based on Bradley's actions, immediately returned fire with their rifles. Bradley ducked down and began to move back up the driveway. continued to return fire as Bradley moved up the driveway and two of their rounds struck him. Bradley fell to the ground face down in the driveway. Both fired a total of forty-eight (48) rounds at Bradley. The Immediate Action Team then formed up with their ballistic shields and slowly approached, Bradley was found to have been struck with one round on the right side of his head which exited the left and what appeared to be another round that struck his groin area. Bradley was rolled over onto his back and his handgun was located with the slide back. Deputies handcuffed Bradley and immediately began CPR. Deputies called for EMS personnel which were already staged around the corner from the scene. Upon EMS arrival, they attempted life saving measures but determined Bradley was deceased. At this time, a crime scene was established and secured.

Agency witnesses:

Charlotte County Sheriff's was dispatched to a verbal disturbance in which a person was armed with a gun at 6266 McKinley Terrace, while en route he was advised that shots had now been fired in the house. Upon arrival, made contact with Kimberly (wife of Bradley) and she told him Bradley was inside the house with a gun and had fired shots. Kimberly also stated that Bradley was intoxicated had Kimberly go over to and took up a position across the street at 6283 McKinley Terrace. saw Bradley in the front of the driveway as he turned around and stumbled away, ignoring all verbal commands. An Immediate Action Team was then formed and arrived with a PA vehicle.

watched Bradley come in and out of the residence numerous times and yell "fuck you" and "let's do this" for approximately an hour. then saw Bradley walking down the driveway with a purpose and as he approached the end of the driveway, watched as he took a two hand shooting stance and fire a round at the PA vehicle and Immediate Action Team. saw the muzzle flash from Bradley's gun and returned fire along with stated Bradley immediately ducked down and quickly moved up the driveway. continued to fire his rifle at Bradley until he fell, at this time his rifle locked back and he dropped the magazine and put in another magazine, but stopped firing. The Immediate Action Team then formed up and moved towards Bradley with the shields leading the way. saw Bradley lying face down with heavy blood and brain matter around him. As Bradley was turned over onto his back his handgun was observed and moved away. handcuffed Bradley as gloved up and began CPR.

Charlotte County Sheriff's was dispatched to a verbal disturbance in which a person was armed with a gun at 6266 McKinley Terrace, while en route he was advised that shots had now been fired in the house. Upon arrival, made contact with who was with Bradley's wife, along with and they informed him of what they knew about the incident. As they were speaking, saw Bradley and called out to him to show his hands. Bradley said "fuck you" and stumbled up the driveway. was assigned to the Immediate Action Team and took a position across the street at 6283 McKinley Terrace for the next hour as and attempted to get Bradley to surrender. then saw Bradley walking down the driveway and heard a gun being cocked. watched as Bradley walked down the driveway and saw that he had a handgun in his right hand, which he relayed to the other deputies. As Bradley got to the street, he took a two hand shooting stance and fired a round at the deputies. stated that he saw the muzzle flash from Bradley's gun and returned fire. said Bradley ran

up the driveway as he followed him with the sights of his rifle. reloaded his rifle and then formed up with the Immediate Action Team to advance. Bradley was lying face down and was rolled over. saw Bradley's gun and it was moved prior to CPR being administered.

was assigned to the Immediate Action Team and told to carry a ballistic shield. observed Bradley going in and out of the residence and say fuck you, I'm not coming out. saw Bradley come down the driveway and step out in the road. Bradley took a two hand shooting stance, aimed at them, and fired one round. returned fire until Bradley fell down. Approached Bradley with the Immediate Action Team and saw him on the ground, along with his handgun.

arrived at the scene and was immediately approached by Tyler Dodd, who told him he had been shot at and pointed to the residence. was assigned to the Immediate Action Team and told to carry a ballistic shield. observed Bradley take a shooting stance and fire towards the P.A. vehicle. stated he saw two flashes from Bradley's handgun and then heard deputies return fire. Approached Bradley with the Immediate Action Team and saw him on the ground, along with his handgun.

was assigned to the Immediate Action Team and was armed with a less-lethal shotgun. heard Bradley say, "this is not gonna end well, you know. Let's get it on." saw that Bradley was armed with a handgun. observed Bradley walk down the driveway the last time, rack the handgun, take a two hand shooting stance and fire a round at them. then returned fire. Approached Bradley with the Immediate Action Team and saw him on the ground, along with his handgun.

responded to the scene and confirmed that all parties had been evacuated from the residence, except for Bradley. backed a P.A. vehicle up off the road near the Immediate Action Team and attempted to speak with Bradley but he pointed his gun at him. later observed Bradley coming down the driveway and told him to show his hands. then watched Bradley point an object at him and heard a "bang". heard deputies return fire and saw Bradley fall down.

made contact with Kimberly who had a dog with her and listened to what had happened with Bradley. saw Bradley stumbling outside as he walked back into the residence. obtained Bradley's phone number from Kimberly and called him. Bradley threatened along with everyone on the scene and stated he was not coming out peacefully. Bradley said what had happened here is hearsay and you have no right to be at his house. Bradley also said that if you knock on my door it will be the last door you ever knock on. then provided deputies on the scene with this information over his radio. heard the Immediate Action Team yell "show us your hands, show us your hands" and then heard gunshots.

Complete interviews, along with transcriptions are contained within the case review.

Civilian witnesses:

All Civilian witnesses including, Bailey Martin, Kimberly Rundle, Elizabeth Rundle, Mary Irene Rundle, Jennifer Dodd, Tyler Dodd, Awnah Dodd, Carl Leroy Bailey, Austin A. Tracy, Lorraine McVey, Ethan Doering, Joy C. Hall, Lieutenant Adam Baer (Englewood Fire), Dominic Fanti (Englewood Fire), Robert Craft (Charlotte EMS), and John

Otto (Charlotte EMS) provided sworn testimony which detailed their observations. The complete interviews along with the transcriptions are contained with the case review.

Crime scene, laboratory & Autopsy reports:

The Charlotte County Sheriff's Office Crime Scene Unit responded to the scenes at 6266 McKinley Terrace and 6283 McKinley Terrace. The scenes were photographed and items of possible evidence were marked for identification. Numerous evidentiary items were collected including forty-eight (48) fired .223 Rem caliber cartridges located at 6283 McKinley Terrace where i . . . fired from. One (1) unfired Speer 15 .223 Rem caliber cartridge located in the front yard. A projectile was also recovered on the ground in front of the PA vehicle along with a .223 magazine containing eight (8) unfired cartridges (belonging to ,

Sig Sauer M400 semi-automatic rifle, .223 caliber, . . . and . . .
Sig Sauer M400 semi-automatic rifle, .223 caliber, . . . were recovered from the back seat of
vehicle. . . rifle had one (1) unfired cartridge in the chamber and thirty unfired
cartridges in the magazine (Speer 14, .223 Rem), along with an empty .223 magazine. . . rifle had no
unfired cartridge in the chamber and twenty-nine (29) unfired cartridges in the magazine (Speer 18, .223 Rem).

At 6266 McKinley Terrace on the outside, the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office recovered one (1) fired Hornady 9mm Luger cartridge in the driveway, a Kahr TP9 9mm semi-automatic pistol, . . . with suspected blood on it and had the slide locked back possibly due to a malfunction. The Kahr contained a magazine which had six (6) unfired Hornady 9mm Luger cartridges in it and was located in the driveway near Bradley. Ten (10) suspected projectile fragments were located outside, one near Bradley. Two (2) Ballistic Shields and a Remington 870 less lethal shotgun, . . . containing four (4) unfired 12 gauge stabilized beanbag cartridges. Numerous bullet holes and strikes were documented on the outside of the residence. Bradley's right front shorts pocket contained four (4) fired Hornady 9mm Luger cartridges and eleven (11) unfired cartridges (9 Hornady 9mm Luger and 2 F.C. 9mm Luger), along with a P.B. cal. 9 para magazine containing 13 unfired F.C. 9mm Luger cartridges and a set of keys in his left front shorts pocket.

Inside of 6266 McKinley Terrace, the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office recovered a Beretta PX4 Storm 9mm semi-automatic handgun, serial number PX2206U, in the garage. One (1) fired Hornady 9mm Luger cartridge located on the floor in the living room. An empty P.B. cal 9 para magazine containing eight (8) unfired Hornady 9mm Luger cartridges, black holster, empty box of Hornady 9mm Luger ammunition, two (2) unfired 9mm Luger cartridges (1 Hornady and 1 F.C). Four (4) suspected bullet holes in the interior garage door were documented and measured.

At the Medical Examiner's Office, Bradley's pink t-shirt, navy blue shorts, black/olive green Crocs, metal handcuffs and several projectiles were recovered. All evidence was collected and placed into evidence at the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office Crime Scene Lab. Both crime scenes were also documented using FARO scans. The following items were transported to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for analysis and comparison.
. . . Kahr TP9 handgun, Beretta PX4 Storm handgun, Five (5) fired Hornady 9mm Luger cartridges, six (6) projectile fragments, 2 buccal swabs from Tyler Dodd, 2 swabs of blood from Bradley, Swab from magazine and unfired cartridges of the Kahr 9mm handgun, Swab from front and rear surfaces of the Kahr 9mm handgun, Swab from rough surfaces of the Kahr 9mm handgun, Swab from front and rear sights of the Beretta 9mm handgun and a Swab from the rough surfaces of the Beretta 9mm handgun.

Doctor R.H. Imami of the District 22 Medical Examiner's Office performed an autopsy on Bradley Rundle. According to the report authored by Doctor Imami, Bradley sustained two gunshot wounds, one entered the right side of the head and exited the left, leaving two tiny lead-jacket fragments which were recovered. The second gunshot wound was to the right hip and entered the sacrum (bone), this projectile was also recovered.

Doctor Imami determined Bradley died due to gunshots and the manner of death was classified as homicide.

On November 26, 2019 and December 11, 2019, the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office received the results of the requested analysis and comparisons from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

The Kahr 9MM was also determined to have fired the four (4) projectile casings discovered in Bradley's shorts pocket. The projectile that was suspected to have been fired by Bradley at the deputies was recovered from the area in front of the PA vehicle but determined to be of no value for microscopic comparison. The projectile recovered from Bradley during the autopsy displayed rifling characteristics similar to firearms by Sigarms (Sig Sauer) and consistent with being fired by

Closing:

Based on the review of the investigative report, witness statements, and other documentation, and without further evidence to the contrary, it is believed that their weapons believing that the lives of others were in immediate jeopardy and used deadly force to stop the threat. It is my opinion that use of deadly force, in this case, is justified.

This investigation is closed pending a legal review of the facts.
